KEY POINTS FOR STUDY & REFLECTION

- To be still sometimes means surrendering.
 Surrendering for some can look like setting aside all the ways to protect one's self and pride.
- We tend to fill our days with busyness or fixing.
 Don't be intimidated by silence. Silence can cause you to address issues that you might be running from
- Being still doesn't mean to quit doing the last thing God called us to do nor does it mean to wait for God to do everything.
- Knowing He is there, experiencing Him, turning our attention to Him allows you to be totally engaged with Him.
