

New and Better Covenant

Why did God make a New Covenant?

What was wrong with the Old Covenant?

 *Hebrews 8:6; But now hath he obtained a more excellent ministry, (inasmuch as) by how much also he is the mediator of a better covenant, which was established upon better promises.*

Hebrews 9:15; And for this cause he is the mediator of the new (covenant) testament, that by means of death, for

the redemption of the transgressions that were under the first (covenant) testament, they which are called might receive the promise of eternal inheritance.

 *Hebrews 13:20; Now the God of peace, that brought again from the dead our Lord Jesus, that great shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant.*

What does this all mean? All of the children of Israel, every man, woman and child under the Old Covenant, sinned against God and were condemned with the penalty of death. They lived in the carnal mind, of the flesh, and were condemned to live in bondage to a life of sin. There was no way for them to be released from this condemnation. Under the Old Covenant, the children of Israel offered up sacrifices of goat, calf and sheep. They worshipped on the seventh day of the week. They kept the law of the Ten Commandments. Yet through all of their works of the flesh, there was no freedom from their sins.

God had to devise a means whereby the children of Israel could be released from living a life of sin with the penalty of death. This was through the works of God; fulfilling His promise, which was given to Adam and Eve, to Abraham and Sarah, to Isaac, Jacob and their descendants, the children of Israel. God sent His Son Jesus to die for the sins of the world. Jesus Christ on the Cross removed the carnal mind, of the flesh, which was in enmity against God.

Only through the works of God, believing

in Jesus, the children of Israel were justified, declared righteous.

The New Covenant would become effective when Jesus, the Son of God, died for the sins of the world. Only when the Old Covenant was abolished could the New Covenant take effect. Only upon the Testator's death could there be a New Covenant.

It was of necessity! The Son of God had to be sacrificed for sinners. Jesus was the only perfect, unblemished sacrifice, which could save mankind from their sins.

Jesus dying upon the Cross for the sins of the world was the Way mankind would be reconciled with God the Father.

Now, mankind has been set free from living in the carnal mind, of the flesh. Now, mankind in the power of the Holy Spirit can worship God in spirit and in truth and not commit sin.

 *Hebrews 8:7; For if that first covenant had been faultless, then should no place have been sought for the second. Hebrews 8:8; for finding fault with them, he saith, Behold the days come, saith the LORD, when I will make a new covenant*

with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah:

The New Covenant was founded on a better promise: Jesus Christ died for the sins of the world and removed the carnal mind, of the flesh.

God poured out His Spirit upon all flesh and provided the power for mankind to not commit sin. Mankind has been justified, declared righteous through the works of God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

 *2 Corinthians 3:3; Forasmuch as ye are manifestly declared to be the epistle of Christ ministered (cared for) by us, written not with ink, but with the Spirit of the living God; not in (tablets) tables of stones, but in fleshly (tablets) tables of the heart.*

Under the New Covenant, the covenant of circumcision of the flesh was done away with—removed, abolished—by God circumcising the hearts of mankind.

The law of the Ten Commandments written on two tablets of stone was done away with—removed, abolished—by God writing His law in the mind and on the hearts of mankind.

The sacrificial services with the sacrifices

were done away with—removed, abolished—by God’s sacrifice of His Son, Jesus Christ.

The Sabbath rest on the seventh day of the week was done away with—removed, abolished—by God in the spiritual rest in His Son, Jesus Christ.

Greatest Commandment



Mark 12:28; And one of the scribes came, and having heard them reasoning together, and perceiving that he had answered them well, asked him, Which is the (foremost) first commandment of all?

Mark 12:29; And Jesus answered him, The (foremost) first of all the commandments is, Hear O Israel; The LORD our God is one LORD:

Mark 12:30; And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind, and with all thy strength: this is the first commandment.

Mark 12:31; And the second is like, namely this, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. There is none other commandment greater than these.

Commandment to Teach the Law

God instructed Moses to teach the

children of Israel the spiritual law of God, the law of love which is perfect, blameless, righteous and holy.



Deuteronomy 6:4; Hear O Israel: The LORD our God is one LORD:

Deuteronomy 6:5; And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.

Deuteronomy 6:6; And these words, which I command thee this day, shall be in thine heart:

Deuteronomy 6:7; And thou shalt teach them diligently unto thy children, and shalt talk of them when thou sittest in thine house, and when thou walkest by the way, and when thou liest down, and when thou risest up.

Deuteronomy 6:8; And thou shalt bind them for a sign upon thine hand, and they shall be as frontlets between thine eyes.

Deuteronomy 6:9; And thou shalt write them upon the posts of thy house, and on thy gates.

Galatians 5:14; For all the law is fulfilled in one word, even this; Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself.

More Than all Burnt Offerings



Mark 12:32; And the scribe said unto him, (Well said, Teacher) Well, Master, thou hast said the truth: for there is one God; and there is none other but he:

Mark 12:33; And to love him with all the heart, and with all the understanding, and with all the soul, and with all the strength, and to love his neighbor as himself, is more than all whole burnt offerings and sacrifices.

Mark 12:34; And when Jesus saw that he answered (wisely) discretely, he said unto him, Thou art not far from the kingdom of God. And no man after that (dared) durst ask him any question.

The laws of the New Covenant would be written upon the hearts and put into the minds of mankind. This was the work of God accomplished through His Spirit, which was poured upon all flesh.



John 3:16; For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

Jesus Died for the Sins of the World

Those who believe their sins have been forgiven and remembered no more.

Jesus Became the Veil, the Mediator

Those who believe are permitted to come boldly to the throne of God.

Jesus Abolished the Ten Commandments

Those who believe live under the spiritual Law of God—the Law of Love, the Law of the New Covenant.

Jesus Abolished the Carnal Mind, of the Flesh

Those who believe live in the spiritual mind, of the Spirit of God.

Jesus Abolished the Old Covenant

Those who believe live under the New Covenant of Jesus Christ.

God's Promise of the Holy Spirit



Joel 2:28; And it shall come to pass afterward, that I will pour out my spirit upon all flesh; and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy, your old men shall dream dreams, and your young men shall see visions.

Under the New Covenant, God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—in their righteous works made it possible for mankind to be

set free from living in the carnal mind, of the flesh.

By faith, believing in the works of God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—mankind can now live in the spiritual mind, of the Spirit of God and not commit sin.

New Creation in the New Covenant

2 Corinthians 5:17; Therefore if any man be in Christ, he is a new (creation) creature: old things are passed away; behold, all things are become new.

Hebrews 11:1; Now faith is the (realization) substance of things hoped for, the (conviction) evidence of things not seen.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross for the sins of the world, the promises of God would not have been fulfilled.

Without the works of God, pouring His Spirit upon all flesh, mankind would not have faith believing in Jesus.



Agreement; the act or fact of agreeing, or of being in harmony or accord; an understanding or arrangement between two or more people, countries, etc.; a contract.

Covenant; a binding and solemn agreement to do or keep from doing a specified thing; compact.

First; preceding all others in a series; before any other; 1st.

Law; all the rules of conduct established and enforced by the authority, legislation, or custom of a given community, state, or other

group; any one of such rules; the condition existing when obedience to such rules is general (to establish law and order.)

New; never existing before; appearing, thought of, developed, made, produced, etc. for the first time; existing before, but known or discovered for the first time; recently observed, experienced, manifested.

Now; at the present time; at this moment.

Old; having lived or been in existence for a long time; aged.

Promise; an oral or written agreement to do or not to do something; vow.

What is the Substance of Faith?



Hebrews 11:1 Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.

Does this text define what faith is?

Is there a time, date, or event with this text?



Now; at the present time; at this moment;
at once; at the time referred to; then; next.

Faith; unquestioning belief that does not require proof or evidence; unquestioning belief in God.

Substance; the real or essential part or element of anything; essence, reality, or basic matter.

Hope; a feeling that what is wanted will happen; desire accompanied by expectation. The thing that one has hope for; a reason for hope.



Evidence; the condition of being evident; something that makes another thing evident; indication; sign; something that tends to prove; ground for belief.

Thing; any matter, circumstance, affair, or concern; that which is done, has been done, or is to be done; happening, act, deed, incident, event.

Interpreting Scripture, the Word of God

In order to come to the right conclusion about the interpretation of any scriptural text of the Bible, we should follow the instructions given in the word of God.

Precept upon precept, line upon line. The Spirit of God will lead those who are searching for the truth.

We should be guided in the wisdom, knowledge and understanding from the Holy Spirit regarding the things which are spiritual.

We need to understand God spoke through the prophet Moses regarding the things, which were spiritual. Under the Old Covenant in the carnal mind, of the flesh, the

children of Israel could not understand the spiritual things, which God spoke to Moses.

The earthly sanctuary with all the sacrifices of goats, sheep and bulls could not remove the sins of those who were living in the carnal mind, of the flesh. They were all condemned with the penalty of death under the law of the Ten Commandments.

God needed to find a better way.

God needed to pour out His Spirit upon all flesh. Spiritual things are discerned spiritually.

This was conditional. Only after Jesus died on the Cross for sinners, not before. Now, mankind in the Spirit of God is able to understand the things, which are spiritual—Word of God, Scripture, the Bible—and by faith believe in the works of God.

God's promise to pour out His Spirit upon all flesh has been fulfilled in the New Covenant.

Now, God could speak to both the Jews and Gentiles through His Son, because Jesus is better than the prophets.

Now, in the Spirit of God, mankind has been liberated—set free—no longer in bondage to live in the carnal mind, of the flesh, under the law of sin and death, the Ten Commandments.

The Bible tells us Jesus died for our sins. We are the children of God with an inheritance into the kingdom of heaven with everlasting life.

Now, the time—the moment of truth—Jesus died on the Cross, providing the Way for God the Father to pour out His Spirit upon all flesh.

We are justified, declared righteous, through faith, believing Jesus died for our sins.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—mankind would still be in their sins, without salvation.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—the Spirit of God would not have been poured upon all flesh.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—there would be no hope.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—there would be no faith.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—there

would be no trust.

Without Jesus dying on the Cross—there would be no love.

Conclusion

The “substance” of things hoped for is found in the works of God; called Grace, the love of God for mankind.

The “evidence” of things not seen is found in the works of God.

Those who by faith believe in the works of God that is all the evidence they need—living without any doubt, in full confidence and assurance in the promises, which God has fulfilled.

God, the Father sent His Son to die for the sins of the world. This has been accomplished, completed, finished and done for all sinners—for me and for you.



What does it take to believe in Jesus?



Romans 10:17; So then faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God.

Ephesians 2:8; For by grace (you have been) are ye saved through faith; and that not of yourselves: it is the gift of God.
